

As we know, Hurricane Irma and Maria have left heartbreaking damages to the beautiful islands of the Caribbean. The region consists of 32 countries and spans over 1 million square miles. Fortunately over 70% of Caribbean destinations were not affected according to the latest update from Caribbean Hotel and Tourism Association. Islands that were skirted by the storms received minimal destructions to hotels and their grounds. The majority of hotels are in full operation and are open for business. Island that were hit hardest by the storms are in steady effort to recovery.

<u>Islands open for business include:</u>

- Aruba, Barbados, Belize, Bonaire, Bermuda, Cayman Islands, Curacao, Guyana, Grenada, Haiti, Jamaica, Martinique, Saba, St. Eustatius, St. Lucia, St. Vincent, Suriname, and Trinidad & Tobago.
- Antigua, Cuba, Dominican Republic, Guadeloupe, Monteserrat, Nevis, St. Kitts, The Bahamas, and Turks & Caicos.

Water and power are restored. Communication and transportation including access to roads and airports are back in full operation. Most hotels are open for business. A few resorts such as Sandals Grande Antigua have been scheduled for annual closure or were going under renovation before the storms. The opening dates of these properties are coincidental in timeline rather than consequential recovery from these natural disasters.

Barbados being one of the many islands unaffected by the hurricanes are welcoming you for their traditional Run Barbados Marathon in the weekends of December 1-3, 2017. The prestigious Run Barbados series originated three decades ago by Sir Austin Sealy and Carl Bayley have evolved into premier sporting attractions with runs winding along streets of Bridgetown, a UNESCO World Heritage Site. The spirit is "Come for the Run, Stay for the Fun!".

Islands currently on the road to recover and will be eager to welcome visitors once again include:

Anguilla, Barbuda, British Virgin Islands, Dominica, Puerto Rico, St. Barts, St. Croix, St. John, St. Martin (Saint Martin- French and Sint Maarten- Dutch) and St. Thomas.

Power and communication are restored to parts of the islands. Plans are underway to rebuild damaged roads and resume full operation of affected airports and ferry ports. A few hotels open their doors this December and most are scheduled for as early as Spring 2018.

It is only with our support that these islands are able to recover speedily and return the stunning beauty of nature to us for relaxation and enjoyment. It is hoped that visits in any form will drive tourism and help rebuild the islands and lives of all their residents. Islands not affected by the storms are open in full swing to enchant you with the beauty of the Caribbean. Those more severely damaged will be able to welcome visitors as soon as next Spring!
